### The <tbody> Tag in HTML 5

The <tbody> tag is used to create the main body of a table in HTML, which consists of the two rows in this HTML table example:

	Multiple Column Heading	
First Column Heading	Second Column Heading	
Row 1	Row 1 Column 1	Row 1 Column 2
Row 2	Row 2 Column 1	Row 2 Column 2

## Rules for coding the HTML `<tbody>` element

### Child Elements of the `<tbody>` tag

#### `<>` tag(s)

A `<tr>` tag for each table row with `<td>` tag(s) for each table cell in the table body.

#### [global attributes](#)

In addition to the personal attributes of the `<tbody>` tag below, any of the [common HTML attributes](#) can also be coded.

## Changes in HTML 5 - <tbody> Tag

### What's new in HTML 5

### Differences between HTML 5 and earlier versions of HTML

The [2000-2010 Recommendations from the W3C HTML Working Group](#) defined the [HTML namespace](#) for the **tbody** element type name along with the names of all [HTML element types](#). In older (pre-2000) [versions of HTML](#), element type names were not associated with a namespace.
