### HTML <head> Section

The `<head>` HTML head section separates metadata information from actual content of the document in the [body section](#). It is created by the `<head>` tag, which is coded inside the [html element](#) at the top of the [HTML structure](#). The head section must always contain a [page title](#), which appears in the title bar of the web browser window. The head section may also contain other [metadata tags](#).

#### Content of HTML Head Section

The expected content of the `<head>` tag consists of HTML elements categorized as [metadata content elements](#). (In the [HTML tag list](#), click on an HTML tag to see the content model of that element.)

The content of the `head` element is expected to be [metadata content](#) with some restrictions. Therefore, the following [metadata elements](#) can be coded between the starting `<head>` tag and the ending `</head>` tag:

HTML Tag	Content of <head>...</head> Element
<a href="#">&lt;title&gt;</a> <b>required</b>	a single required <a href="#">title element</a> with the title that is to appear in the browser's address bar
<a href="#">&lt;base/&gt;</a>	an optional <a href="#">base element</a>
<a href="#">&lt;command/&gt;</a>	optional <a href="#">command element(s)</a>
<a href="#">&lt;link/&gt;</a>	optional <a href="#">link element(s)</a>
<a href="#">&lt;meta/&gt;</a>	optional <a href="#">meta element(s)</a>
<a href="#">&lt;noscript&gt;</a>	optional <a href="#">noscript element(s)</a>
<a href="#">&lt;script&gt;</a>	optional <a href="#">script element(s)</a>
<a href="#">&lt;style&gt;</a>	optional <a href="#">style element(s)</a>
<a href="#">&lt;rdf:RDF&gt;</a>	optional <a href="#">RDF element(s)</a>
<a href="#">&lt;!--comments--&gt;</a>	possibly interspersed with <a href="#">HTML comments</a>
